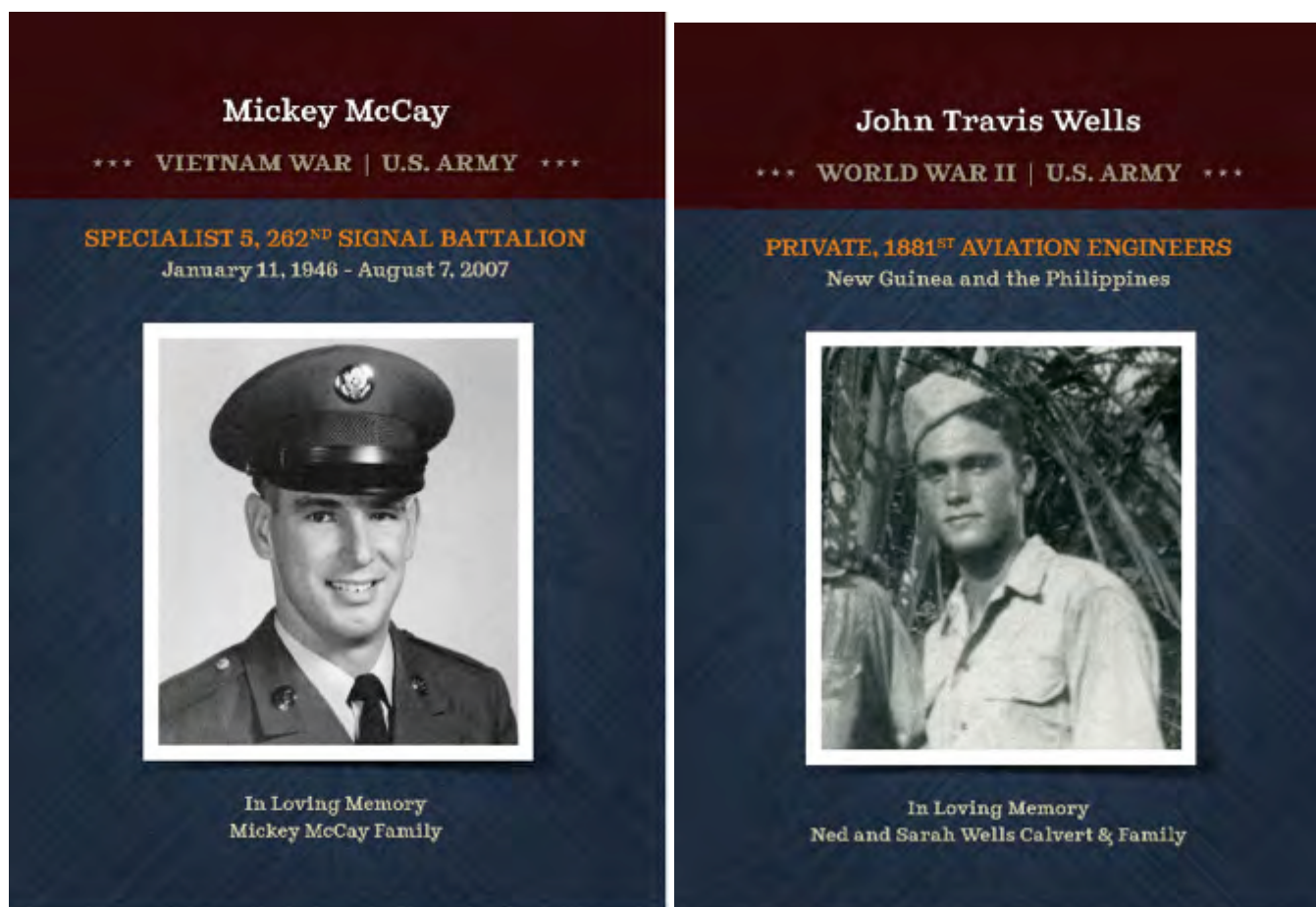

William H. Wood

*** **U.S. ARMY AIR CORPS** ***

WORLD WAR II
P-47 Thunderbolt Pilot

Born in Marshall in 1923, William H. Wood joined the Army Air Corps at age 17. He was trained as a P-47 "Thunderbolt" pilot. Assigned to escort U.S. bombers making raids on Germany from England, he was shot down over Holland on his 23rd mission. He was captured and sent to Stalag Luft III in Sagan, Germany. Ravaged by air raids, food shortages and disease, Stalag Luft III was miserable. With the Russian Army approaching, 10,000 prisoners of war were moved, including 1st Lt. Wood, in a forced march through a blizzard. Six days and 62 miles later, the POWs arrived in Moosberg near Munich. The U.S. Army liberated them three months later. Stalag Luft III was depicted in the movie *The Great Escape*.

Served August 7, 1933 to July 9, 1988

James was born in Shamrock, Texas and grew up along historic Route 66 in McLean, Texas. He joined the Navy at age 17 and served aboard the *USS Juneau* (CL AA-119) from 1950 to 1954. The *Juneau* was the first U.S. naval vessel engaged in the Korean War. After the *Juneau*'s first Korean tour, it returned to Long Beach, California and was greeted by actress Doris Day. James was part of the welcoming committee that presented her with a bouquet of roses. After the military, he was an operator and electrician with Texas Eastman Company from 1954 to 1988. He was a member of the James F. Taylor Masonic Lodge #169, AF&AM of Hallsville.
